The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODT) District 12 – CUY Tower City Bridges Project:

QCI and our teaming partners are supplying construction inspection, materials testing and scheduling services for this highly visible project taking place in the heart of Cleveland's Tower City District. QCI is an ODOT Pre-qualified Construction Management Firm and the Tower City Bridges project is QCI's fifth inspection contract with District 12 since 2009.

Cleveland Metroparks (CMP) TIGER Trail Projects:



The Cleveland Metroparks is constructing four new multipurpose trails around the City of Cleveland including the Wendy Park Bridge, Whiskey Island Trail, Redline Greenway Trail and the Lakefront Bikeway/Canal Basin Connectors. QCI has been selected by the Cleveland Metroparks to provide the LPA contract administration and inspection services for this project. Having successfully provided LPA contract administration and inspection services on over 100 LPA projects, QCI has an in-depth understanding of the documentation requirements associated with this funding. Our Firm delivers well organized documentation that is easily accessible allowing the CPE and the Owner to make well informed decisions that keep the project moving forward. QCI has provided construction administration and inspection services to the Cleveland Metroparks for twenty one years.

The Ohio Turnpike & Infrastructure Commission (OTIC)– 59-18-01 Resurfacing Project:



QCI is providing contract administration and inspection services for the repair and resurfacing of the eastbound and westbound lanes of the Ohio Turnpike from Milepost 127.20 to 136.20. QCI has actively participated on various construction inspection contracts with the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission since 2001.

City of Mentor LAK – US20 – 9.47 LPA:

This project is a federally funded LPA project that includes the widening of Mentor Avenue (US20) to accommodate a two way left turn lane approaching Center Street (SR 615), and adding a second left turn lane for westbound traffic turning south at SR615 in the City of Mentor. QCI was selected for this work based on our qualifications in LPA contract administration and construction inspection services. Our firm has assigned an ODOT Pre-Qualified Construction Engineer Level 2 as the Construction Project Engineer (CPE) and a Project Inspector. QCI is documenting the work in accordance with the ODOT LPA Manual ensuring the City of Mentor's funding is never at risk. Additionally our active construction engineering and inspection process to monitor the Contractor in accordance with the plans and specifications will ensure the City receives a well built improvement for its residents and businesses. This will be QCI's fifth successful LPA project for the City of Mentor.

Radnor Township, PA Memorial Library Project:



The Library renovation and expansion includes a 5,100 sq. ft. addition, new HVAC system, elevator, renovated bathrooms including a family bathroom, dedicated teen space, an expanded children's library, small group meeting rooms, an entrance facing West Wayne Avenue and more. QCI has provided an Owners Representative (Clerk of the Works) for contract administration of the project and a Resident Project Representative for inspection of the contractors work from our Radnor Pennsylvania office which was opened in 2016. In addition and we are currently entering into our second contract for services with the Township. QCI's PA office is fully staffed and is providing construction inspection and contract administration of transportation, utility, and vertical construction projects in the surrounding area. The library was completed and opened in July of 2018.

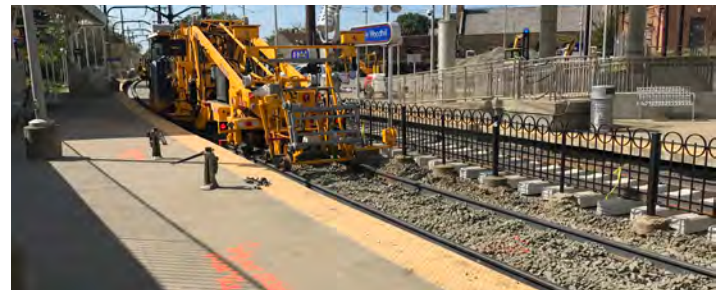
Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works, Construction Management and Supplemental Services 2017-2018:

QCI has held various construction engineering and construction inspection contracts with the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works since 2001. Our current assignment involves contract administration of the County's Vehicle Maintenance Consolidation Project. The County is consolidating all of their maintenance facilities into one central location on Harvard Avenue. QCI's Construction Manager and Resident Project Representative will supply support services to the County's Engineering Department for the Duration of the \$17M two year facility renovation. QCI has been providing Construction Management, Contract Administration and Owners Representation services for vertical construction projects for over 30 years. Our projects include but are not limited to Police and Fire Stations, Municipal Maintenance and Administration Facilities, Recreation Facilities, Transit Terminals, Libraries, Private Offices and Manufacturing buildings.

Shaker Heights 2018 Right of Way Inspections:

QCI provides various communities across Ohio with inspection services to protect their interests when outside agencies including private utilities (gas, electric, phone, etc.) perform work within the right of way. Our inspectors provide on-site observation of the contractors work to ensure that any utilities within the right of way are protected, and all items impacted by the work, including but not limited to roadway concrete and/or pavement, curbs, under drains, sidewalks, aprons, city trees and landscaping are restored in accordance with the contract documents. Additionally, QCI inspectors provide electronic daily project reports using Build-A-Form® Engineer Reporting System for progress of the work, documentation of project specific non-conformance work, public complaints and tests performed including lineal feet of pipe and services replaced. When required, daily project reports can be maintained noting contractor's equipment, manpower, construction activities, locations of work and project specific quantities providing calculations. QCI has worked on various contracts for the City of Shaker Heights for 14 years.

Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (GCRTA), On-Call Inspection Services 2016-159:



QCI started our fourth multi-year contract with the GCRTA for On-Call Construction Inspection Services in 2017. QCI has developed a specialized staff that are trained and experienced in trackwork inspection to support GCRTA staff during various projects on an on-call basis. Projects range from inspection of trackwork, facility construction, grade crossings, bridge work, line shutdowns for maintenance, and outside agency/ODOT construction to ensure the interests of the GCRTA at the track level and in the right of way.



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
